...Attendance Matters

There is continuing concern both locally and nationally about the number of student absences from schools and colleges.

At Guthlaxton College we value regular attendance and recognise that it is essential for all our students to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and have better chances in life. Every student at the College, in line with the Government's expectations, is expected to maintain an attendance level of 95% and above. It is the responsibility of everyone in our College community — parents, students, staff and governors to ensure that our young people achieve this level. As a College it is essential that we monitor and review the attendance of all students constantly.

Each year there are 190 College days which leaves 175 days for holidays, shopping, birthday treats and non urgent medical and dental appointments. We are unlikely as a College to authorise absence for these reasons. The following relates absence to percentage attendance.

Attendance over one College year if a student had:

98%	Less than 4 days absent from school
95%	Less than 10 days absent from school
90%	4 weeks absent from school
85%	5½ weeks absent from school
80%	7 ½ weeks absent from school

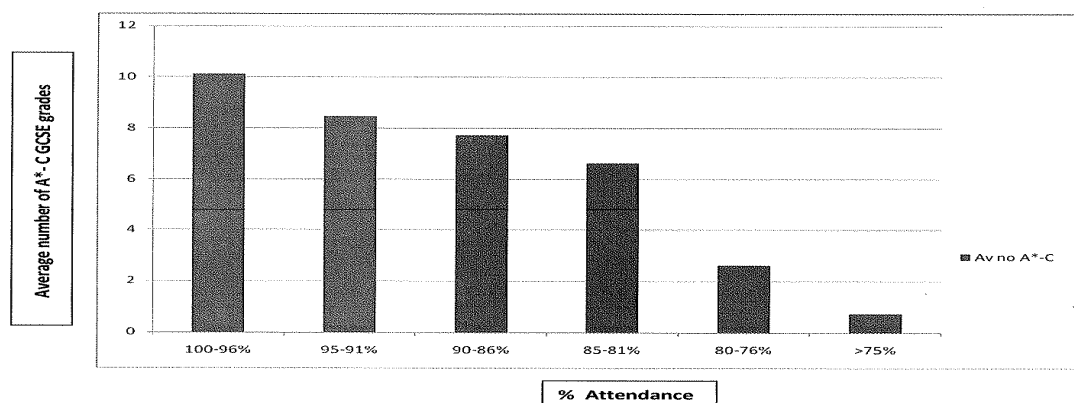
Attendance over 5 years in secondary education if a student had:

85-90% attendance =	having about half a year off school!
80% attendance =	38 weeks off school = one whole school year missed!

Our whole College attendance target is 95%.

We appreciate that young people are unwell from time to time and that there may be exceptional circumstances for absences, and we ask you to think carefully about keeping your son or daughter out of school. There is a strong connection between attendance and achievement at College. Absence is proven to have a significant negative impact upon a young persons' educational attainment. On average 17 absences during a College year results in one less grade per subject at GCSE. The graph below shows how attendance affected the examination results of previous Year 11 students. As you can clearly see, the higher the students' attendance at College the better they achieve and vice versa.

In addition, regular College attendance keeps young people safe, whereas evidence shows that students who truant are more likely to be involved in crime and anti social activity. As a College we have a duty of care and trust you will support us in fulfilling this requirement.

We hope that you appreciate how crucial good College attendance is to your son or daughter's progress, achievement and chances in life. We look forward to working with you to ensure that their attendance is the very best it can be to give them the very best chances in College and beyond. We hope you recognise that Attendance Matters.

We will monitor attendance closely and absences will be scrutinized by our Care & Guidance team. In addition we are supported by the LA Attendance Improvement Officer who will initiate formal procedures where necessary. I would like to remind you that Penalty Notices will be considered in cases where students are either absent from College without authorisation or when an absence is linked to a holiday application that has not been authorised.

If you feel there is anything we can do to support you or your son or daughter, or would like to discuss this matter further please do not hesitate to contact your son or daughter's House or Assistant House Head. It is important that we work in partnership to demonstrate to our young people that attendance matters.

I am delighted to report that Guthlaxton's attendance for the last academic year continued its upward trend and we achieved 91.6%. Whilst this is below the national target we are working closely with the Attendance Improvement Service to maintain the improvement.

We are proud of the year on year improvements and would encourage all parents/carers to support the College by ensuring that your child is not absent from College.

In our next edition we will update you of this year's progress.

...Punctuality Matters

Equally, we care about punctuality and have been concerned about lateness across the College both for registration and lessons. Lateness results in lost learning and lost learning results in lower chances of success in the external examinations as outlined below.

Punctuality

5 minutes late to every lesson

5 lessons a day x 5 minutes = 25 minutes

25 minutes x 5 days a week = 125 minutes

125 minutes x 39 weeks a year = 81 hours

81 hours = 3 weeks, 1 day and 1 hour of lost learning

This is equivalent to an attendance figure of 92%
reducing your chances of getting A* - C by at least 1 grade per subject

We will continue our Gate Late Patrols throughout this term and trust that you as parents/carers will support us by ensuring that your son/daughter arrives on time and prepared for learning.

We thank you in your efforts to support us in striving to meet the Every Child Matters outcomes.

Be Healthy and Stay Safe

College Counsellor: Every Monday and Friday the College provides a counselling service which is available for all students. Kathy Elliott, a qualified and experienced professional, specialises in working with young people and adolescents. She has worked for the College for a number of years supporting a wide range of young people through difficult traumas.

Students can arrange to meet with Kathy by speaking with their Assistant Head of House.

School Nurse: The College benefits from the support of Alex Yeomanson, School Nurse. Alex is based at Guthlaxton School Nurse Clinic. She covers all the schools in Wigston and South Wigston. Alex is a qualified nurse with experience in contributing to the physical and emotional well-being of our students. She also provides a link between home and College and works with other agencies to give support, guidance and advice as required. Alex can also refer to other agencies when families may need additional support.



Any student wishing to see Alex should contact her at the Clinic. Parents/carers may make contact on 0116 2883707. Answer phone messages are listened to daily and Alex will arrange to see you.

There is also a Young Peoples Health Service at the Clinic serviced by a range of health professionals who offer advice, support and guidance in health matters such as diet, drugs, sexual health and so on.

Attendance Improvement Officer: Jayne Bond works with the College and other schools in the Wigston area to support students, parents/carers and teachers regarding attendance matters.

She has worked at Guthlaxton College in this capacity for many years and she has been highly effective in her work.

She offers advice, guidance and support to students and their parents/carers over attendance issues. She has a range of contacts and is able to act as an excellent link between College and other services.

Educational Psychologist: The College is offered specialist support from the Educational Psychology Service through the services of Phil Harbour.

Phil works with teaching and associate staff at the College to support students and their families who are facing difficulties in achieving their full potential. He is an excellent professional who offers a range of strategies which benefit many young people.

Uniform

Thank you to all parents for supporting the College in our efforts to improve standards of dress.

The start of term has been really positive and students have responded well to the introduction of the new uniform.

The following is a reminder for all parents and students of our uniform requirements.

<p>The emphasis of the Sixth Form Dress Code is smart, not casual clothing; smart trousers or skirts and dresses, shirts with ties or blouses, clean smart shoes. All outdoor clothing, hats, scarves etc should be removed when entering the classroom.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Trousers should be full length; leggings, combat style trousers, jeans or shorts are not acceptable.• Shirts should be largely plain; lumberjack designs are not acceptable.• Girls should be wearing tops with shoulders covered; vest tops are not acceptable.• All boys should be wearing a tie.• Sensible shoes should be worn (no trainers).• Jewellery should be discreet.• Jumpers, cardigans and sweaters should not contain huge logos.• Hoodies are not considered to be smart and if worn as outer clothing should be removed in college.• All students should wear the Sixth Form lanyard and ID.	<p>The KS4 Guthlaxton College uniform consists of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Plain black jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan with the College logo.• Plain black full-length trousers or skirts. It should be noted that leggings, combat style trousers, jeans or shorts are not acceptable.• Plain white shirt/blouse with a collar attached and a Guthlaxton College tie for the boys. Girls may wear open neck blouses without a tie.• Sensible black footwear. Boots, trainers and high heeled shoes are not part of the College uniform and should not be worn.• Outdoor coats should be plain and removed prior to entry to the classroom. This removal includes hats, scarves and gloves.• All students should wear the House lanyard and ID.

Welcome to the start of the new academic year. It gives me great pleasure to introduce the new Head Boy, Head Girl and Deputies; Indiana Smith, Rebecca Borrows, George Landers and Jaideep Dhaliwal who were voted in by the student body in June. They are joined by a strong team of Chairs amongst the Sixth Form Management sub groups. Already, they have delivered information to current Year 11 students and parents/carers about sixth form life, have organised their first social event, represented the sixth form at a Full Governor's meeting and, at the time of reading, will have planned and executed their first charity fundraising event for Jeans for Genes.



Mrs Voss and I are really impressed with their energetic and positive start to the term; lots of ideas and plans are buzzing around the Team. Jaideep is aiming to set up a sixth form newsletter and is inviting students who have a passion for writing or who want to get into journalism to join him. The Team have already held a competition to design a sixth form logo around the theme of the current college logo which will be launched in October.

We were very pleased with our A level results this year; having Sarah Pike at Cambridge reading Mathematics has been a real boost to our students' aspirations, as well as the excellent results from Ryan Mills (2A* & 2A) now at the University of York reading Computer Science and Jack Vardy (1A* & 2A) now at Loughborough University reading Mathematics and Accounting and Financial Management. To date, we have three applications to Oxbridge for entry in September 2012. At Guthlaxton, we like to keep in touch as far as possible with our ex-students; in September, James Tipler who left the college in 2008, came into college to meet up with current students who are interested in pursuing a career in Law, (James is in his final year at Cambridge). His experiences are invaluable to their plans and future applications to university.

Year 12 and 13 students appear to have settled into college really well; they are wearing their ID badges in accordance with college policy, look well presented in smart sixth form dress code and are attending all timetabled lessons and private study sessions. The LRC has been providing additional support for study skills by sharing details of the Oliver research facility and other services offered. Increasing demands will come to both year groups in terms of assessed work and evidence of research, as well as them having organised folders to demonstrate that they can work independently and complete wider reading.

Year 13 students are busy preparing their personal statements along with their online application through UCAS. We have an internal college deadline of **12th October** for students to *Pay and Send to referee*, to enable us to guarantee that their application is finalised, checked and sent to UCAS before Christmas. Each reference is written by subject teachers and the group tutor, then checked by the Head of House, proof read by Gary Cambers, (Ex Deputy Head) before being checked and sent by Mrs Wilson. In terms of student finance, which will be the next thought in the back of students and parent/carers minds, we have a number of sessions scheduled over the coming weeks to support the planning process.
